

Good News for the Living and the Dead.

Alleluia, Christ is risen! (Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!)

During the children's sermon on Easter Sunday I talked to the children about my father's death the previous Wednesday morning, and how Jesus' death and resurrection are really good news especially for dead people. Because when you're dead, there's no illusion of being able to pull yourself up by your own bootstraps, or helping yourself in any way. You've got nothing. I carried my father's death with me through the Great Three Days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter and those four services were just what I needed. They gave me words and song for a time when words often fail and songs go unsung. If he had to die (and he did, we all do),



my dad picked a great time to die. I cannot think of a better day for a funeral than the first Saturday after Easter Sunday, and I am looking forward to celebrating the resurrection then and commending my father into God's care.

But while Jesus' and resurrection are surely good news for dead people like my father, they are also really good news for people who are still alive on this side of the grave. Because the gospel is not only about new life after death, but also about new life now, before death, and through death as well. One of the last things we did as a family while Dad was still alive was to gather at his hospital bed and sing hymns, including one he requested, "Lord thee I Love with All My Heart." (We'll sing that at the funeral too.) Just as that hymn sustained Dad in his last days, so does our singing and praying and gathering around word and sacrament sustain us through all the days of our lives, reminding us of who we are and whose we are, so that we can live lives of integrity and joy right here and right now, even in the face of death. So rejoice and be glad this Easter season. Be comforted, encouraged, and enlivened by Christ present in your life and in this community of faith at Grace.

The Grace Office will be closed next **Monday**, **April 8**. The office will be open on Tuesday and will return calls and emails then. Thank you!


Wood Carving Group



GLC Food Pantry Monthly Update

The Grace Pantry continues to be very busy. In February we served 306 families (more than 1,145 individuals). We are seeing an average of more than 60 families per week and some of those are new clients. In February the food we were able to provide each family would cost approximately \$60 in the store. Through the Eastern Illinois Food Bank we are able to purchase \$3 in food for every \$1 donated. Without your support it would not be possible to continue this vital ministry.

We are pleased to announce two new board members: Marlys Scarbrough and Bruce Winter. We want to express our deep appreciation to Kathy Bowersox and Royce Wilken for their tireless contribution to the board in the past several years as board members.
