Festival of Creation in Christ

Last April at the Institute of Liturgical Studies I learned of an ecumenical movement to create a new festival day on the liturgical calendar called Creation in Christ. This will be the first new festival day since the introduction of Christ the King a century ago (1925). I have since learned that this is not a new idea but has been percolating in the background since at least 1989, when the Orthodox Church issued an invitation to other world church bodies to observe September 1 as a day of prayer for creation. This coincides with the beginning of the liturgical year on the Orthodox church calendar when the creation of the world is the theme.

ELCA materials being developed for this festival note that this is still an evolving ecumenical discussion, and a single date has not yet been agreed upon. The first Sunday in September is currently the suggestion. Another is the Sunday closest to the fall equinox, when the days and nights in both hemispheres are in alignment, which may have been the earlier practice of the eastern church before the 5th century. Yet another option is the nearest Sunday to October 4, the commemoration of St. Francis of Assisi, known for his love and care for the creation. In addition to a single festival day, some faith communities (Episcopal, Roman Catholic, United Methodist) have been officially observing a Season of Creation from September 1 through October 4 for some time now.

Why this new festival, and why now? One of the most obvious reasons is the growing awareness of human-caused climate change, together with other ecological concerns like the destruction of natural habitats and the noticeable increase in extinction of species over the past century. These environmental crises have not gone unnoticed among Christians. In fact, one of the pioneers of environmental theology was Joseph Sittler, a Lutheran theologian who was still on the faculty of the seminary I attended when I started. This growing awareness is also reflected in ELCA worship resources, which added a regular petition for creation to the prayers of intercession. The default invitation to those prayers reflects this emphasis, inviting us to pray “for the church, those in need, and all of God’s creation.”

We’re easing into this focus on creation at Grace this year, returning to setting 12 from the All Creation Sings hymnal supplement for the fall, and using one of its creation-themed communion prayers for the month of September. Evensong at Emmanuel

The choir of *Emmanuel Memorial Episcopal Church* will present a **Choral Evensong on September 6, at 5:30 p.m.** The service of Choral Evensong is rooted in deep musical tradition from seventeenth century to present day. Music at this service will span from the Baroque era to present day by American composers: Amy Beach (*Preces and Responses* arr. by Ardrey-Graves) and Robert Lehman (*Canticles* after Croft and Purcell) and British composers: Henry Walford Davies (*Psalm 130*), John Goss (*These are they which follow the Lamb*), and Simon Lole (*Jesu, the very thought of thee*). **Emmanuel is located at 102 N. 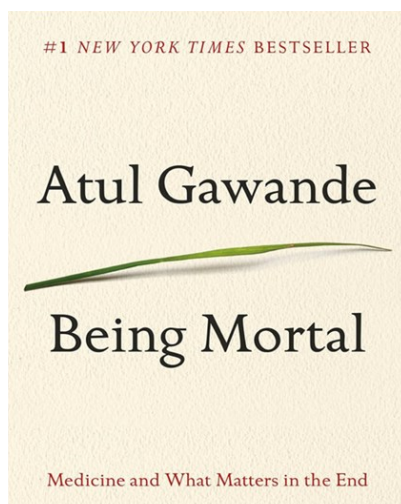

Game Night at Grace

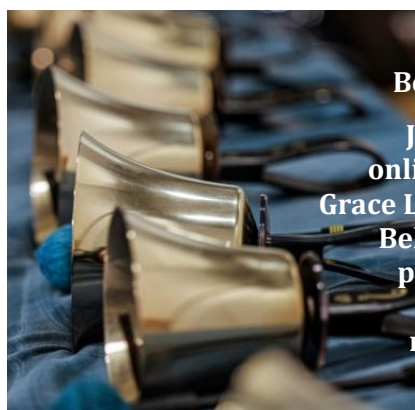

In **July 2026**, the pantry reached:

- **August 6:** 101 households, 368 individuals
- **August 13:** 82 households, 289 individuals
- **August 20:** 90 households, 355 individuals
- **August 27:** 71 households, 275 individuals

That's **344** total families and **1287** people in our community that have been served by this ministry during the month of July.

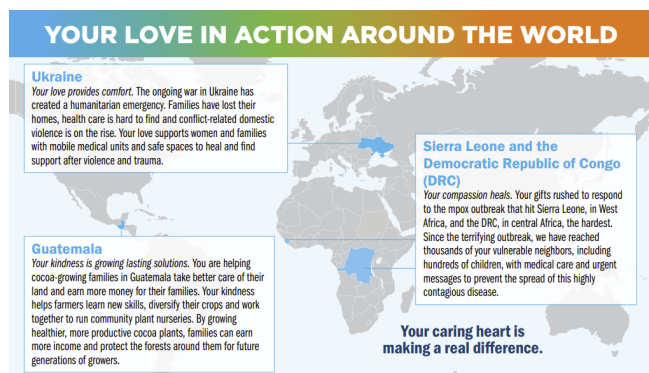
